SWINE FLU UPDATE FOR GPS

All practices should have recently received emailed updates from NHS Sheffield. The LMC has also received recent communications from the GPC. In summary:

- Best advice is that confirmed cases of swine flu are likely to continue over the summer months, with the possibility of a surge in the autumn flu season.
- It is vital that every suspected case of swine flu A/H1N1 is reported to the Yorkshire and Humber Swine Flu Call Centre on 0845 2700899 (Monday to Friday 8am to 6pm, Saturday and Sunday 10am to 4pm). The Call Centre will advise on swabbing and authorise the use of antivirals when appropriate. Please discuss any testing with the flu centre or with public health when the flu centre is closed.

- Algorithms for the management of swine flu A/H1N1 are updated as new information becomes available. Please check regularly for updated advice and algorithms for the management of swine flu A/H1N1 on the Health Protection Agency (HPA) website http://www.hpa.org.uk to ensure that you are following the most up to date guidance. Antivirals will only be authorised for those patients meeting the case definition who have been notified to the Yorkshire and Humber Swine Flu Call Centre.

- Pneumococcal vaccine reminder: Secondary bacterial infections of the respiratory tract are common following influenza. Now is a good time to check that all your eligible patients (whether 65 years or over, in clinical risk groups or infants as part of the routine childhood immunisation programme) are up to date with their pneumococcal vaccine. - Protective Personal Equipment (PPE): Supplies of masks, aprons, gloves and hand rub supplied by NHS Sheffield MUST ONLY be used where swine flu is suspected or confirmed they should not be used for any other purposes. It is understood that the DH will supply masks and hand gel, however, all other PPE (aprons and gloves) are the responsibility of each organisation/practice.
