There is an ever growing list of demands on health professionals to disclose information to third parties

> such as insurers, the police, social workers, the DVLA and the relatives of deceased patients. There is also growing concern over the implications of increased access to patient information by electronic means and the use of patient information for secondary uses such as audit, commissioning, payment by results, research and teaching.

> The British Medical Association (BMA) Ethics Department has produced a Confidentiality and Disclosure of Health Information Toolkit. The purpose of the toolkit is not to provide definitive answers for every situation, but to identify the key factors which need to be taken into account when such decisions are made. The toolkit consists of a series of cards about specific areas of confidentiality relating to children, adults who lack capacity and the deceased, as well as the secondary uses of information. The cards refer to guidance from bodies such as the General Medical Council (GMC), BMA and health departments that should be used in conjunction with the cards.

REPEAT DISPENSING GUIDANCE

NHS Employers, the GPC and the Pharmaceutical Services Negotiating Committee (PSNC) have produced joint guidance for practices, to support the implementation of repeat dispensing. The guidance covers:

- What repeat dispensing is including the difference between the repeat dispensing (RD) model and the traditional repeat prescribing process.
- Expected uptake of repeat dispensing in practices, with examples of suitable patient groups.

- Benefits of repeat dispensing for GPs, practices and patients
- Top ten tips for successfully implementing repeat dispensing gathered from those practices and pharmacists that have implemented it.

MEDICINES USE REVIEWS GUIDANCE

NHS Employers, the General Practitioners Committee (GPC) and the PSNC have produced joint guidance for practices, on the medicines use review (MUR) service. The guidance covers:

- What a MUR is and what it is not (including how the MUR service differs from a clinical medication review by the GP).
- What the MUR consultation covers.
- The potential benefits of MURs for GPs and patients.
- How to achieve best value and benefits from MURs.
- Supporting templates: an MUR reporting form and a template notification letter from the pharmacy to the relevant GP.

PRESCRIPTION CHARGE EXEMPTION FOR CANCER PATIENTS

The DH plans to have arrangements in place so that eligible cancer patients will be entitled to exemption from prescription charges in respect of all items dispensed on or after 1 April 2009.

Practices should have received pads of revised application forms, together with guidance entitled *Extension of the List of Medical Conditions Giving Exemption from NHS Prescription Charges: Guidance for Doctors.* Further copies of the guidance can be downloaded from: http://www.dh.gov.uk/en/Healthcare/ Medicinespharmacyandindustry/Revi ewofprescriptioncharges/index.htm

The GPC will be writing to the DH to raise a number of concerns and questions on the guidance, which they feel lacks clarity.

LICENSING REGULATIONS CONSULTATION

The GMC has launched a threemonth consultation on its draft *License to Practise Regulations* and supporting guidance for doctors. The consultation covers the GMC's proposed arrangements for granting, withdrawing, refusing and restoring licences to practise.

Licences to practise are being introduced in autumn 2009 under the revalidation scheme. In the future, all doctors wishing to work within the medical profession in the UK will require one in order to be considered fit to practise.

GP REFERRAL INCENTIVE SCHEMES

The GPC has recently issued this guidance note due to concerns that have been raised regarding the development of incentive schemes that aim to reduce referral rates or the cost of referrals from general practice to secondary care. TELEPHONE REDIRECTION SERVICES

The GPC has requested that LMCs make practices aware of a problem experienced by a GP practice using a weekend redirection services. This service directs telephone calls to a doctor's house rather than the surgery. The telephone company had contacted the surgery to make them aware of unusual activity on the line over the weekend, as there had been a high number of calls to premium numbers. It transpired that the line had been hacked by hackers, who then used the outgoing line to make Apparently, these hackers calls. target doctors, dentists, and surgeries etc, who use a redirection service.

The practice has informed the police of the situation but is still in the position of having to pay a high bill.

It has been suggested that the GPC advise doctors who use redirection services to ensure they have a bar on premium numbers.

PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUPS (PPGS)
