GP CONTRACT 2023/24 UPDATE WEBINARS

The British Medical Association (BMA) is organising 5 webinars to ensure that every GP has an opportunity to hear about this year's contract changes, ask questions, and share their feedback, at no cost:

- Tuesday 21 March 7 pm to 8.30 pm
- Wednesday 29 March 7 pm to 8.30 pm
- Thursday 30th March 7 pm to 8.30 pm
- Wednesday 22 March 12.30 pm to 2 pm
- Thursday 30th March 12.30 pm to 2 pm

General Practitioners Committee (GPC) England officers will deliver the same presentation at each webinar, meaning that attendees need only attend the event most convenient to them.

These webinars will replace the roadshow events familiar to many from pre-pandemic times. The unusual lead up and consequent delay to this year's negotiations has rendered that approach impractical. It will also free up more time for in-person engagement with the officers regarding the future shape of the contract.

CHANGES TO THE GP CONTRACT IN 2023/24: LMC COMMENTARY

Following the publication of the updates to the GP contract for 2023/24 and beyond, the LMC has provided a <u>commentary</u> on what this could mean for General Practice in the city.

Whilst the changes will affect practices differently, the overarching theme of compromising quality care in the interests of one contact disposal (OCD) access metric is going to be very damaging to General Practice.

The LMC is engaging urgently with the commissioners to discuss what kind of support can be provided locally to support General Practice.

As more details emerge in the coming days, we will keep you informed of what this could mean for us all.

GENERAL PRACTITIONERS COMMITTEE (GPC) REGIONAL ELECTIONS

As noted in the February LMC newsletter, nominations were sought in the election of voting members of the GPC as regional representatives for the 2023-2026 sessions in our regional constituency (Barnsley, Doncaster, Rotherham & Sheffield). As our constituency is contested, a mass email was issued by the British Medical Association (BMA) noting that a ballot has opened. LMCs have been asked to increase engagement by also sharing details of the ballot, which will end at **12 noon on Thursday 30 March**.

Information about how BMA members and non-members can vote in the ballot can be found here.

In addition, concerns have been raised with the BMA that some voters were unable to see the GPC election or the correct region to vote in (area of residence vs area of practice). As such, we have been asked to share the following to ensure that eligible individuals are granted access to voting in their regions:

<u>BMA</u> member unable to access the election: The most common reason for members not being able to access an election is due to their member details being out of date. It is worth checking details <u>here</u> and updating anything that is not accurate, ensuring to include a place of work if there is not already one listed. It is also suggested that an email is sent to <u>elections@bma.org.uk</u> noting BMA number and the region to be voted in. The team can then grant access to the election.

Non-members unable to access voting: A BMA web account is needed. Anyone who thinks they already have one but are not sure, are asked to request that the elections team checks by emailing elections@bma.org.uk noting GMC number. The team will be able to grant access to eligible individuals with an account. If an existing account does not exist, this will need to be created - follow the link to 'request a temporary non-member account'. Once an account has been created an ID number will be assigned, which needs to be emailed to elections@bma.org.uk along with details of the region to be voted in. The team can then grant access to the election.

Any queries about the elections process or how to vote in the ballot should be directed to <u>elections@bma.org.uk</u>. Please note the elections inbox is only monitored Monday to Friday 9 am to 5 pm.

PERSONAL INDEPENDENCE PAYMENT (PIP) CLAIMS

We have recently received an update from the General Practitioners Committee (GPC) advising GPs who are having conversations with patients about PIP to signpost the patients to the pages at <u>GOV.UK/PIP</u>. This is so that patients can consider if they may be eligible prior to claiming. The PIP pages include easy-read guides and links to YouTube videos about eligibility, evidence requirements and the claims process. These will help individuals to understand what information they need to provide to support their claim and consider whether PIP is the right benefit for them.

WORKING WITH TORTURE SURVIVORS E-LEARNING

Freedom from Torture, a charity providing therapeutic care to survivors of torture across the UK, have designed a course for doctors and healthcare professionals providing care for refugees and asylum seekers. The course was established in response to requests for training from GPs who are treating increased numbers of asylum seekers. A significant proportion of these patients will have experienced traumatic events, including torture, and have resulting complex health needs. Doctors may feel that they lack the specialist knowledge required to support this group.

Backed with funding from BMA Giving, the 10-module course educates on the physical and psychological impact of torture, the unique treatment needs of survivors of sexual torture and how to document evidence of torture in medical records.
